



SCAVENGER HUNT: TERRIFIC TREES




EDUCATION CENTER

- Sign in at station near door
- Building and bathrooms are CLOSED TO THE PUBLIC due to COVID19 precautions
- Check out the amazing views of the Cove from the back deck

VERNAL POOL TRAIL

- Entire loop is about 0.07 miles
- A very easy-to-walk trail and great spot to view birds

CAPTAIN'S TRAIL

- About 0.1 miles
- Trail leads out to the waterfront and great views of Captain Trash Wheel

MEADOW TRAIL

- About 0.16 miles to the piers, the entire loop (Meadow Trail and Gravel Road) is about 0.31 miles
- Trail winds through beautiful restored meadows

SYCAMORE TRAIL

- About 0.15 miles
- Walk on this trail to view a bald eagle's nest . This is the home of the only documented nesting bald eagle pair in Baltimore City!

WOODLAND TRAIL

- Entire loop is about 0.7 miles
- Features older trees and waterfront views

DRIFTWOOD TRAIL

- About 0.4 miles
- Enjoy views of Masonville Cove wetlands

PIER

- Enjoy fantastic views of Baltimore
